Re-purpose Common Products

Instead of throwing these items away, reuse them!

- Old socks: Tie together for a dog pull toy; store off season shoes in them to prevent scuffing
- Old shower curtain: Use to line your car when transporting dirty items
- Old toothbrush: Use to clean bathroom tiles, jewelry or to polish shoes
- · Greeting cards: Cut and make into gift tags
- Old suitcase: Use to store wrapping paper, bows, tags, etc. for a portable gift wrapping station

Frequently Asked Question

Q: Are pizza boxes recyclable?

A: Yes they are, as long as they are not too soiled! Some grease is okay; boxes that are too greasy should be thrown in the trash.
