**HEALTH COMMISSIONER SECOND AMENDED DIRECTIVE AND ORDER
REGARDING FACE COVERINGS IN PUBLIC**

Pursuant to State Executive Order 20-06-10-01

July 29, 2020

I, Letitia Dzirasa, M.D., Health Commissioner for Baltimore City, Maryland, pursuant to COMAR 10.06.01.06 and the authority delegated to Health Officers by Governor Hogan's Executive Order No. 20-06-10-01 (as amended), Section 4-404 of the Baltimore City Health Code and finding it necessary for the prevention and control of 2019 Novel Coronavirus ("SARS-CoV-2" or "2019-NCoV" or "COVID-19") and for the protection of the health and safety of individuals in Baltimore City, Maryland, hereby authorize and order the following actions for the prevention and control of this infectious and contagious disease under the Governor's Declaration of Catastrophic Health Emergency.

I. Definitions.

- a. "Face Covering" means a covering that fully covers a person's nose and mouth, but is not a Medical-Grade Mask. The term "Face Covering" includes, without limitation, scarves and bandanas.
- b. "Medical-Grade Mask" means an N95, KN95, surgical, or other mask that would be appropriate for a health care setting.
- c. "Social Distancing" means a distance of at least six-feet between persons who are not in the same family or household.

II. Scope.

- a. This Order applies to all individuals 2 years and older, living within or entering the geographic boundaries of Baltimore City.

III. Use of Face Coverings.

- a. Individuals shall wear a face covering when in any indoor public space. Individuals are required to wear a face covering while in outdoor public spaces when maintaining a physical distance of six (6) feet or more from persons who are not members of the same household or residence is not feasible.

- b. Single-use Face Coverings shall be properly discarded in trash receptacles. It is recommended that all reusable Face Coverings be cleaned frequently (at least once per day).
- c. Wearing a Medical-Grade Mask satisfies any requirement in paragraph II. a. to wear a Face Covering, but all Individuals are urged to reserve Medical Grade Masks for use by health care workers and first responders.

IV. Exceptions.

- a. Non-public schools, child care facilities, and youth camps should continue to follow guidance concerning face coverings issued by the Maryland State Department of Education and the Maryland Department of Health.

V. General Provisions.

- a. This Order remains effective until after termination of the state of emergency and the proclamation of the catastrophic health emergency has been rescinded, or until rescinded, superseded, amended, or revised by additional orders.
- b. The underlined paragraph headings in this Order are for convenience of reference only and shall not affect the interpretation of this Order.
- c. If any provision of this Order or its application to any person, entity, or circumstance is held invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, all other provisions or applications of the Order shall remain in effect to the extent possible without the invalid provision or application. To achieve this purpose, the provisions of this Order are severable.
- d. An individual who knowingly and willfully violates this Order or any Local Order is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding one year or a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.
